Safer Roads Program

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Ku-Ring-Gai and Dharug peoples as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is reducing speed limits in some areas to provide a safer road environment for pedestrians and other road users.

Following a request from Hornsby Shire Council, the speed along Sefton Road, Milson Parade, Malsbury Road, Clarke Road and College Crescent in the suburbs of Thornleigh, Normanhurst and Hornsby will be reduced from 60km/h to 50km/h.

A recent safety review in this area revealed 21 crashes resulting in 20 injuries had occurred between 2019 and 2023. As a result of the review and Council feedback, Transport is reducing the speed limit along these regional roads to 50 km/h to improve safety and bring the roads in line with the NSW Speed Zoning Standards.

What work are we doing?

Work includes:

- removing the 60km/h signs and installing new 50km/h signs
- painting the new speeds onto the road in two locations.

When and where we'll be working

To minimise traffic disruption and for the safety of our workers and other road users, our work will be completed at night.

Work will take place from **Monday 4 November** to **Thursday 7 November 2024**, from **7pm to 4am**, weather permitting.

Further notification will be provided should there be significant changes to the signage installation schedule.

What will this mean for you?

To ensure the safety of road users, temporary traffic changes will be in place when we are working.

You may notice:

- a work zone speed of 40 km/h
- single lane closures
- traffic controllers and signage
- noise from machinery and equipment.

Managing our impacts

We will do our best to minimise noise.

Please follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs and keep to the speed limits.
